Don't we all long to live life to the fullest? To be a part of a community that is authentic, supportive, and life-giving... To grow a little deeper... To make real friendships that are life giving... To transform our busy days into adventures with the God of the universe...

What are Life Groups?

Life Groups are a regular gathering of 6 -14 people who meet to discuss and study the Bible so that God's word transforms their lives. In this way, Life Groups reveal God's goodness, making disciples who embody Christ's love in their homes, schools, workplaces, communities and world. Life Groups do life together!

Why Life Groups?

God has designed us to crave community. We're at our best when we connect with and care for those around us. Life Groups encourage connections like these and therefore draw us closer to the God who calls us together. We trust and rely on God to prepare us, through Life Groups, to live life to the fullest!

What should I expect when I go to a Life Group?

Each Life Group is unique, reflecting the people of the group. You can expect a regular gathering involving conversation, prayer, and discussion to engage us in serving in the world—and usually these things involve food! All Life Groups have three common characteristics:

- Study** – by reading, questioning, praying over, and learning about the Scripture passage, Life Groups gain deeper understanding and life application.
- Support** – by caring and praying for others, listening to their stories and sharing yours, Life Groups strengthen relationships between members and with God.
- Service** – by committing to pray regularly for one another, to serve others beyond our congregation and/or to join in a regular ministry task, Life Groups impact members and the world around them.

Some groups focus primarily on study, others on support amidst life's challenges; other groups spend much of their time serving. Each group is different, so find the right group for you!

What do Life Groups study?

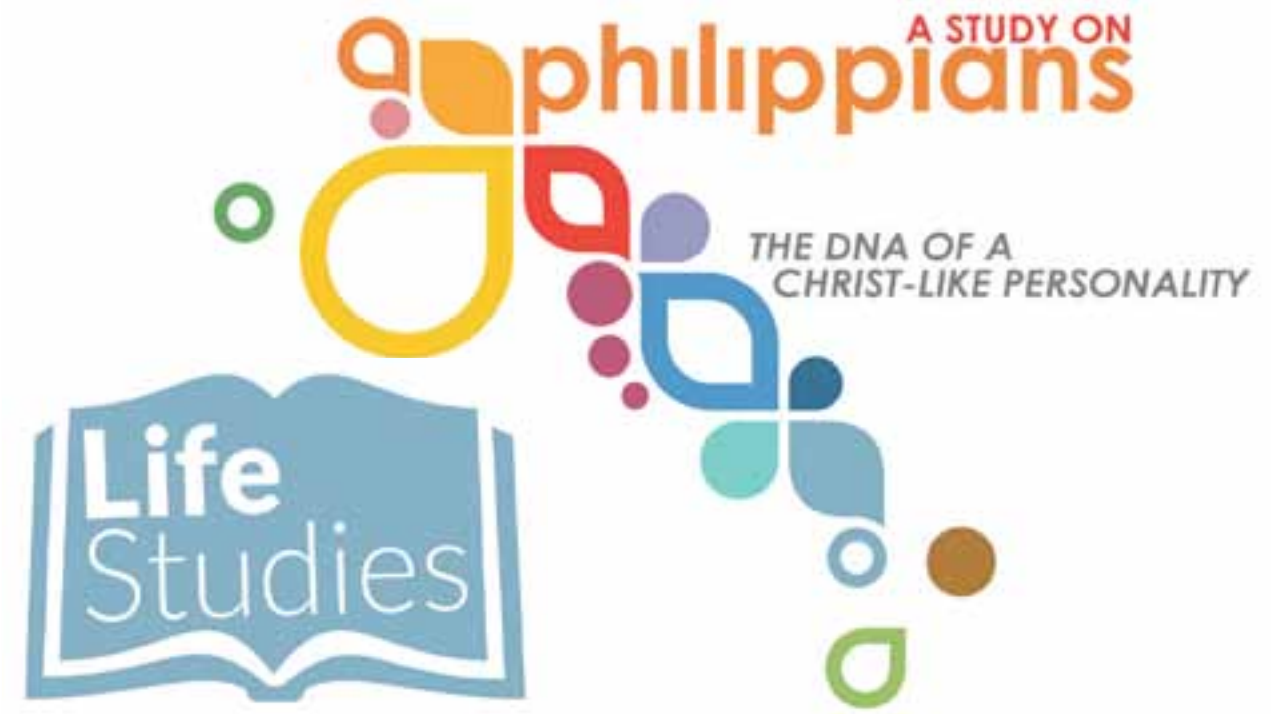
Most Life Groups follow along with the sermon series, discussing the Bible passage that was preached during the previous weekend's worship services. The Life Group questions that are available are to get conversation going—the goal is not to “answer” each question, but to work toward life transformation. This happens through reading, discussing, asking your own questions, applying the Bible to life, praying, and committing to live differently. There are also resources crafted each week that go deeper into the Bible passage—these are not the answers to the questions, but they are a resource for anyone who wants additional study and food for thought. How can I join a Life Group?

There is a Life Group for everyone! There are Life Groups meeting throughout the week, on different days and at different times. There are men's, women's, couples, and mixed Life Groups. How is a “Life Study” different from a “Life Group”?

Teaching is an essential component of a Life Study. While a Life Study can (and usually will) have a time of “life group” discussion, the Life Study includes time when an instructor (often in a large group) helps you go deeper in your understanding of the Bible text.

What will the Life Studies Study?

We will study the Bible, most of the time selecting one book to dig into deeply. The studies will complement, but not overlap, sermon topics. This fall we will be studying Philipians.

What Life Studies are Available?

This fall there will be a Wednesday Night Together Life Study, a Monday Morning Women's Life Study, a Tuesday Morning Women in Management Life Study, a Tuesday Evening Women in Management Life Study, a Thursday Morning Women's Life Study, and a Tuesday Morning Men's Life Study.

Wednesday Night Together

TrainingWheels (2 - pre-K)

Every family will receive the gift of "My Bible Book." Each weekend we send home a colorful 'story card' for our lesson that fits into the "My Bible Book." If you don't have a "My Bible Book" already, please be sure to pick up one from Miss Susie. During every 5:30 p.m. Saturday and 9:30 and 11:11 a.m. Sunday service, we begin with 'free play' time where kids play and connect with their teachers. Next, we go to Large Group and worship God together through music and Bible Story. We end TrainingWheels time back in our individual classrooms with a craft activity to reinforce the story, snack and play time until our parents arrive to pick us up.

CrossTraining (Kindergarten - 6th grade)

Our theme this year is: A Bible in Every Hand and God's Story in Every Heart. Our goal is to help kids know what that means! During every 5:30 p.m. Saturday and 9:30 and 11:11 a.m. Sunday service, we begin with 'community' time where kids share their week's experiences. Next, we worship God together through music, followed by bringing our offerings forward so we may serve others and know we make a difference in the world. Then in Large Group, we teach Biblical truths that make us REAL followers of Jesus. We end CrossTraining in Life Groups to build an all generation community, pairing kids with amazing Life Group leaders.
