The Gospel According to Mark

Read Chapters 14-15

When reading these chapters, try to put out of your mind any of the passion narratives from other Gospels.

1) Read Mark 14:1-11. Why isn't Passover time a good time for the Jewish authorities to arrest Jesus?
What are the various attitudes toward Jesus people express in this section?
Contrast the actions of the woman with the perfume to the actions of Judas.
2) Read Mark 14:12-26. What preparations has Jesus made in order to celebrate the Passover with his disciples?
What does Jesus reveal to his disciples during supper? What does their reaction reveal about them?
What is Jesus trying to teach his disciples in vv 22-25?
How does this meal make sense of Jesus' death and his kingdom?
3) Read Mark 14:26-42. Jesus has been predicting his death for quite a while. What is another prediction he makes (vv2 30)?
How does their response contrast with their response to his call to stay with him in prayer in the garden?
4) Read Mark 14:53-72. How does Mark contrast Jesus and Peter (vv 53-54, 61-62, 66-71)?
What are the different charges that are brought against Jesus?
5) Read Mark 15:1-15. How does Jesus respond to his accusers?
Pilate wasn't looking to crucify Jesus. What different motivations of Pilate were revealed by his questions and actions?
