


DON'T FORGET YOUR FATHER'S SONG: DEUTERONOMY 32

Brandon Munchow brings us to week three, Father's Day, where we dive into the Song of Moses. This is found in Deuteronomy 32. This week, we are focusing on a song God wrote through Moses as a divine parent to the Israelites.

G O D ' S F A I T H F U L N E S S , C O M P A S S I O N , D I S C I P L I N E , R E D E M P T I O N

As you go through the song of Moses, take time to analyze the overarching narrative in which Moses is trying to exploit God's character. His perspective is drawn from the years God led him through the wildness. Moses is warning generations not to forget the goodness of their God, "The Rock, his work is perfect, for all his ways are justice. A God of faithfulness and without iniquity, just and upright is he...who made you and created you?...remember the days of old; consider the years of many generations; ask your father, and he will show you, your elders and they will tell you" (Deuteronomy 32:4;6;7). Moses is drilling this into their heads! As the chapter continues, he yearns for them not to become a nation void of counsel.
